Using the mouse or screen to stay on what the adult has put us on.




Dinosaur action to remind us to use the KidRex search engine.

In Year 1, we focused on learning what to do if we felt unsafe when using the internet. We looked at unexpected messages, unkind behaviour online and how we shouldn't use a device without the permission of an adult. We used our learning to create a poster or handy bookmark.



























In Year 2, we learned about how we can stay safe when using different devices by following the SMART rules. We read the story of Smartie the penguin and then used Purple Mash programme '2create a story' to make our own books about how to stay safe when using the internet.



In Year 3, we enjoyed discussing our favourite things that we do online and completed our digital footprint design using these ideas. Also, we listened to the virtual assembly which celebrated 'Safer Internet Day 2022.' The assembly led to some thoughtful discussion in our classes on its theme of respect and exploring relationships with our friends online. Finally, we completed the quiz based on this assembly and all our classes gained 100%. We are now internet safety experts!

In Year 4, we focused on gaming online as this is what a lot of us like to do in our free time. We looked at different online scenarios someone playing a game online might face, and we discussed appropriate and inappropriate responses. We worked in groups to discuss our ideas and feed these back to the rest of the class.



To promote Safer Internet Day in Year 5, we have been thinking about different uses for the internet and how we can ensure we are safe when using it.

We started the lesson by looking at a screenshot of an online game and identified any potential risks on the site; we were also able to suggest different steps we could take to avoid these risks. We then started to look at different scenarios that could take place online, and discuss how we would feel and what we would do if we were in that situation.

We all designed a new symbol to be placed online, which could be pressed if we ever felt uncomfortable in anyway when using the internet.


