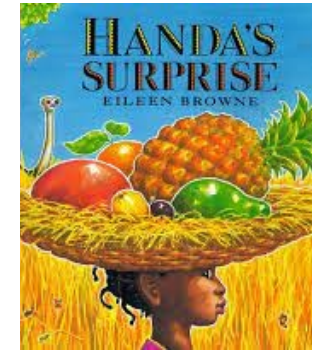
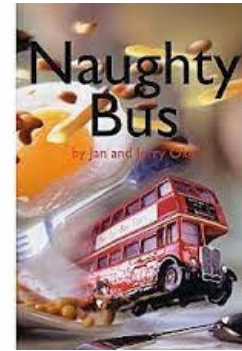
Claude Monet - a famous French artist of the 19th century.
