Reading



Use sounds to work out words when reading

Name the letters of the alphabet in order

Read some everyday words by sight (e.g. their, could, asked)

Read words made up of 2 or more other words (e.g. playground, bedroom)

Read words with apostrophes that show missing letters (e.g. I'll, we'll)

Know the difference between fiction and information texts

Re-read if a sentence doesn't make sense

Retell a familiar story and make predictions about what might happen next

When reading a text, talk about likes and dislikes

Talk about how characters might be feeling, what they might do next, etc

Link what is read to own experiences

Read with pace and expression (e.g. pausing for full stops or using voices for different characters)

Join in with phrases that repeat or are familiar (e.g. "I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house in!")

Writing

Hold a pencil correctly and comfortably

Correctly write all letters and the digits 0-9

Use capital letters for names of people, places, days of the week and 'l'

Say a sentence out loud before writing it

Have clear spaces between words in a sentence

Use 'and' to join ideas in a sentence

Re-read writing to check that it makes sense

Write sentences in order so that they make sense

Use capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks correctly in sentences

Spell key familiar words such as 'you', 'are', etc (words lists can be provided by class teachers)



Mathematics



Count to 100

Read and write numbers in words from zero to twenty

Count on and back in steps of 1, 2, 5 and 10 from any number to 100

Say one more or one less than a number to 100

Read and write number sentences using + , - and =

Know and use addition and subtraction number facts to 20 (e.g. 0 + 10 = 10, 1 + 9 = 10)

Understand and use the words equal to, more than, less than, fewer, most and least

Add and subtract 1-digit numbers (1, 2, 3, etc) and 2-digit numbers (10, 14, 19, etc) to 20, including zero

Solve missing number problems for addition and subtraction using objects or pictures to help

Solve simple multiplication and division problems using objects or pictures to help

Recognise, find and name 1/2 or 1/4 of an object, shape or amount

Know the days of the week and months of the year in order

Know o' clock and half past times

Recognise £1, 50p, 20p, 10p, 5p, 2p and 1p

Compare length, height, weight/mass and capacity using words such as long, longer, longest, heavy, light, full

Recognise and name 2D shapes (e.g. circle, square) and 3D shapes (e.g. sphere, cuboid)

Describe position, direction and movement as whole, half and quarter turns
